

PROFESSOR DR IAN BLACKSHAW

Professor Dr Ian Blackshaw is an International Sports Lawyer and a former Vice President Legal Affairs of the ISL Sports Marketing Group, Lucerne, Switzerland. He qualified as a Solicitor of the Supreme Court of England and Wales and holds a Master's Degree in International Sports Law and a Doctor of Laws Degree from Anglia Ruskin University (ARU), Chelmsford and Cambridge, United Kingdom, where he is a Visiting Professor. He is also a founder member of the ARU International Law Unit. At Cambridge, he teaches Alternative Commercial Dispute Resolution as part of a Post-Graduate Programme on International and European Business Law.

He is also a Visiting Professor in International Sports Law at Wolfson College Cambridge and at the University of Staffordshire, United Kingdom. He has also acted as an International Consultant on the Commercial Aspects of Sport and Sports Dispute Resolution Modules of the Sports Law and Practice LLM Programme of De Montfort University, Leicester, United Kingdom.

He is also a member of the Advisory Board of the Mediation Centre at Canterbury Christ Church University, United Kingdom.

He is an Honorary Fellow of the International Sports Law Centre of the prestigious TMC Asser Instituut in The Hague, The Netherlands and a former Contributing Editor of The International Sports Law Journal published by the Centre, as well as a frequent member of their 'Round Tables' and speaker at their Seminars on Sports Law, held in The Netherlands and the rest of Europe.

He is also Visiting Professor of International Sports Business Law and Management at the University of Leiden Business School, The Netherlands and the Universities of Pretoria and Johannesburg, South Africa, where he is also a member of the *Isa Pele* Consulting Legal and Business Training Group, for whom he leads Seminars on Alternative Dispute Resolution, including Arbitration and Mediation. He is also a member of the TCA Training and Consulting Group in Nairobi, Kenya, where he leads Seminars on Negotiating and Drafting International Commercial Contracts, mainly for several Departments of the Kenyan National Government.

He has also lectured for CIES (Centre for International Sport Studies), Neuchatel, Switzerland and AISTS (International Academy of Sports Science and Technology), Lausanne, Switzerland and is also Visiting Fellow at the prestigious Adams & Adams Centre for Intellectual Property Law at the University of Pretoria, South Africa.

He is a member of the Court of Arbitration for Sport, Lausanne, Switzerland; a member of the Expert Dispute Resolution Panel of EQUESTES in The Netherlands; and a member of the World Intellectual Property (WIPO) Arbitration and Mediation Center, Geneva, Switzerland, where he adjudicates on the WIPO Panels

on ‘Domain Name Disputes’ and ‘Expert Determination’ of International Commercial Disputes.

He is also a member of the Anti-Doping Panel of the International Bobsleigh and Skeleton Federation, Lausanne, Switzerland.

He is also a prolific author of articles for several Law Journals, including the Entertainment and Sports Law Journal, the World Sports Law Report, the IBA Business Law International Journal, the European Lawyer, Marquette Sports Law Review, the Journal of Global Sport Management and the TMC Asser Year Book of International Sports Arbitration Law 2015, and also several Books on Sports Law, many of which are part of the Asser International Sports Law Series, including Books on ‘*Sports Image Rights*’, ‘*Sport and TV Rights*’, ‘*Sport Mediation and Arbitration*’ and ‘*Sports Marketing Agreements: The Legal, Fiscal and Practical Aspects*’ all published by the TMC Asser Press in The Hague, The Netherlands. His latest published work is ‘*International Sports Law: An Introductory Guide*’ which was published in 2017 also by the TMC Asser Press. He is currently completing another Book on ‘*International Sports Branding Law*’ to be published by EE International Publishing.
