THE COURT OF ARBITRATION FOR SPORT (CAS) TO HEAR ITS FIRST CASE IN ITS SHANGHAI CENTRE

Lausanne, 9 August 2013 - The Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) will hold its first hearing at the CAS Alternative Hearing Centre in Shanghai on 12 August 2013, following its inauguration last November. The case concerns an appeal filed by the South Korean football club FC Seoul against the Australian football club Newcastle Jets FC with respect to a monetary claim for training compensation. The matter will be decided by a Sole Arbitrator: Mr Efraim Barak (Israel). Pursuant to the Code of Sports-related Arbitration, the hearing will not be open to the public.

The CAS is an international institution independent of any sports organization which provides services to facilitate the settlement of sports-related disputes through arbitration or mediation by means of procedural rules adapted to the specific needs of the sports world.

The CAS was created in 1984 and is placed under the administrative and financial authority of the International Council of Arbitration for Sport (ICAS). It has its headquarters in Lausanne, Switzerland, with decentralized offices in New York and Sydney. In 2012, the ICAS concluded partnerships with the cities of Shanghai (China), Abu Dhabi (UAE), Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia) and Cairo (Egypt) in order to promote sports arbitration in these regions and to use local facilities to hold hearings and meetings. The CAS handles approximately 350 cases per year.
