Professional Experience

From 1989 to 1990, he was part of the Legal Service. From 1989 to 1994, he held the position of Deputy Honorary Prosecutor at the Public Prosecutor’s Office of Rome, appointed by the High Council of the Judiciary. From 1998 to 2005, he served as Chief Prosecutor of the Federal Prosecutor’s Office at the Italian Basketball Federation. At the Italian Football Federation, until 2016, he first served as a member and from 2006 as President of the National Registration Commission, later becoming the Federal Tribunal – Registration Section.¹

In 1996, he served as Prosecutor at the CONI National Anti-Doping Prosecutor’s Office. This experience enabled him to gain significant expertise in sports offences connected with doping in all sports disciplines. From 2000 to 2008, he was advisor to the Italian Tennis Federation, dealing with regulatory, organizational, contractual, sponsorship, and partnership aspects of the Internazionali d’Italia.

From 2019 to the present, he has been a member of the Anti-Doping Division of TAS and annually participates in the plenary meetings organized by that authority. From July 2017 to October 2017, he served as a member of the Board of Directors of Ascoli Picchio FC 1896, with responsibility for Marketing, Sponsorship, and Stadium Management.

From 27 February 2019 to 11 October 2019, by virtue of appointment and extension decrees issued by the President of the Council of Ministers, he served as Extraordinary Commissioner of Aero Club d’Italia. From 31 December 2018 to 31 December 2020, he held a two-year appointment as expert supporting the Technical Unit for the coordination of Economic Policy (NTPE), conferred by decree of the Undersecretary of State to the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, Secretary of CIPE.

From July 2020 to June 2024, he was a member of the CONI Sports Agents Commission, appointed on the proposal of the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, which selected him among experts with

proven legal and sports experience and recognized independence. From December 2023 to May 2024, he was a member of the working group established within the Office of the Chief of Staff of the Minister for Sport to prepare the measures required to implement Articles 12(1) and 8(5) of Legislative Decree 37/2021, concerning the figure of the Sports Agent.

From October 2025 to March 2026, he provided Legal Consultancy to the Sports in the Territories Division of Sport e Salute S.p.A. in the fields of administrative, civil, and sports law. Since September 2025, he has been a member of the Commission established by the Government and CONI (Italian NOC) to reform the national sports justice system.

He has also long served as consultant to CONI, the Italian Tennis Federation, the Italian Equestrian Sports Federation, the Italian Boxing Federation, FIDAL, the Italian Basketball Federation, the Italian Hockey Federation, the Italian Bocce Federation, the Italian Gymnastics Federation, FIJLKAM, and the Italian Rugby Federation.

He has furthermore served as consultant to the Lega Nazionale Professionisti Serie B, the Istituto per il Credito Sportivo, the Centro Sportivo Italiano, CUSI – Centro Universitario Sportivo Italiano, and the Centro Nazionale Sportivo Libertas APS.

Academic Experience

He assists companies operating in the sportswear sector in tax disputes concerning tax credits related to Research & Development activities. Since February 2017, he has been a contract lecturer at the University of Rome “Foro Italico” in the Master’s Degree in Sport Management (LM 47), teaching Labour Law.^[1]

Since October 2021, he has been a contract lecturer at the Faculty of Law of the University “Guglielmo Marconi” in the degree course in Legal Services Sciences, teaching Sports Law. Since April 2022, he has been a member of the Scientific Committee and lecturer of the Executive Master in Sports Law and Governance of the Sports Phenomenon organized by IMT School for Advanced Studies Lucca. From 2016 to 2018, he taught in the Advanced Course in Motorcycling Management organized by the International Motorcycling Federation and the Foro Italico Foundation, in the module dedicated to sports justice.

From February 2011 to 2013, he was Director of the Advanced Course in Sports Law at the Faculty of Law of LUMSA. From the academic year 2002-2003 to 2015-2016, he taught Sports Law at the Faculty of Law of LUMSA, and from 2015 he also taught the Laboratory of Sports Justice. From September 2002 to December 2010, he was Coordinator of the University Master’s Degree in Sports Law and Economics

at the Faculty of Law of LUMSA, personally handling the economic aspects and the funding required for the academic activities and training internships.¹

As a lecturer and expert in the field, he has given talks and presentations at conferences on sports law at LUISS, the University of Milan, within the Advanced Course in Sports Law and Sports Justice named after Professor Lucio Colantuoni, at the Bicocca University of Milan, within the Sport Management and Marketing Society Master's program at the University of Cagliari, at the "Pegaso" Online University, at the CONI School of Sport, at the Department of Legal Sciences of the University of Salento, and at the Milan Bar Association. He has also spoken in the training activities for under-35 sports executives of C.U.S.I. NEXT and participates as a speaker in the specialist orientation course for preparation for the sports agent exam organized by the CONI School of Sport.^[1]

Publications

In 2005, he published the academic sports law manual titled "Il diritto nello sport" with Giappichelli in Turin, subtitled "Principles, subject, organization". In September 2009, Giappichelli published the second edition, updated and expanded with new topics, including, for example, EC sport. In December 2016, Giappichelli published the third edition, completely revised. All editions highlighted aspects related to event organization and the raising of resources necessary to finance the institutional activities of sports bodies and sports events.^[1]
