

Ercus Stewart, Senior Counsel, was called to the Bar of Ireland in 1970 and to the Inner Bar (Senior Counsel) in 1982. He holds two diplomas in International Commercial Arbitration from UCD and DIT, Dublin. Mr. Stewart is a Chartered Arbitrator (CIArb, London), FCIArb, Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, London, and Arbitrator with CAS/TAS, Switzerland, and Sports Disputes Resolution Panel, London. He is a member of Panel of ICDR and AAA, New York and Dublin, CIArb, London, ICC, Paris, The Law Society Panel, etc..

Mr. Stewart has practised at the Bar since 1970, in Commercial, Civil Law, Contract and Labour Law. He is also involved in Domestic and International Arbitration, as arbitrator and as Counsel. He is Chairman, and was instrumental in the formation, of Just Sport Ireland, an Irish national sports dispute resolution body, as well as the Small Claims Arbitration Scheme.
