Brief Resume

Luis A. Breuer has a Master in Law Degree (LL.M.) from Harvard Law School. He specialized in foreign investment, international law, international business transactions, and corporations.

An associate and later partner of two of the main international law firms in Paraguay (*Vouga & Olmedo* and *Berkemeyer*).

Breuer is specialized and practices law in the areas of foreign investment, international business transactions and contracts, arbitration, energy, M&A, telecoms, sports law, banking, and finance, trusts and securities markets.

In his professional career he has advised several Fortune 500 companies and multinationals.

Likewise, he counseled governmental agencies and represented clients of the public and private sector in projects financed by multilateral organizations such as the World Bank, IDB, IFC, OPIC, among others. He also collaborates in publications of some of these organizations.

Breuer has been a speaker and assisted to various congresses and seminars in Paraguay, in the region, Europe and North America, on arbitration, negotiation and ADR, and has been a member of the ABA, the IBA, and of the Dispute Resolution Section of the latter.

He has been contributor and author in chapters, and has written legal articles on international arbitration, foreign investment, jurisdiction and public order, structured finance, energy, trusts and corporate matters.

In the field of arbitration, Luis Breuer is a member of the International Court of Arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) for a second term (2018-2021), and of the ICC Arbitration and ADR Commission of the ICC. He frequently acts as reporter of arbitration cases in Special Committees sessions and the Plenary Session of the ICC Court.

He is also part of the list of arbitrators of the International Centre for the Settlement of Investment Disputes (ICSID) for a second term (2018-2024).

He has been the consultant in charge of drafting the bill “Arbitration and Mediation Law” of Paraguay (Inter-American Development Bank - Project 5.2 TC 98-05-21-1), which was later passed by Congress as Law No. 1879 on Arbitration and Mediation, currently in force.
