# **Mediation and Arbitration Practice**

Prof. Mironi has been involved as a mediator in many international business and sport disputes as well as in hundreds of commercial, labor-management and employment disputes domestically. Among them major multi-party nationwide labor and public disputes such as a dispute between war widows and the parents of the fallen soldiers, two nationwide medical doctors strike, the negotiations over recovery agreements for the city of Jerusalem and was a leading team member of the consensus building process held between the Bedouin tribes (indigenous people) and the Israeli government. He also arbitrated many commercial, labor-management and employment disputes as a chairman (president) and as a sole arbitrator. Being familiar with both mediation and arbitration, Prof. Mironi has an extensive experience with "switching hats" type hybrid or mixed-mode processes such as med-arb and arb-med-arb.

## **Mediation and Arbitration Rosters**

Prof. Mironi is a roster mediator with CAS Court of Arbitration for Sport (Lausanne), WIPO, Milan Chamber of Commerce, OSCE Mediation and Dialogue Experts and the Panel of Distinguished International Mediators (Moscow). He is also a roster arbitrator with the Israeli Institute of Commercial Arbitration, El Al Airlines, the Trucking Industry and M. T. Bank.

Prior to embarking on the career as a mediator and arbitrator Prof. Mironi had been a partner at Holin Berenzon Mironi - Law Offices and a co-founder and partner at Holin Mironi - Law Offices. Later he served as a special counsel with three of the leading law firms in Israel: Goldfarb, Firon and Amit Pollak Matalon. His main fields of practice: labor-management and employment law, mediation, arbitration, dispute processing design.

### **Academic Positions and Activities**

Prof. Mironi is a Professor of Law at **Haifa University** and **Reichmann University** (IDC). Formerly he was a faculty member at **Tel Aviv University** and Visiting Professor at **Cornell, USC Law School**, the **University of Alberta** and **Humboldt University** in Berlin (The IDR LLM program) as well as Visiting Researcher at the Institute of Law Research and Reform (Canada) and the Alexander von Humboldt Institute for Internet and Society (Berlin, Germany).

Prof. Mironi's areas of teaching and research include: mediation, arbitration, negotiation, ADR as well as labor-management and employment law. He published many books and articles in these fields. His article entitled "The Promise of Mediation in Sport-Related Disputes" was published in 2017 by **The International Sport Law Journal**. Prof. Mironi lectures and conducts workshops in the topic of mediation in sport-related disputes in various graduate sports law programs (Zurich, Madrid, Valencia and Geneva). He is also a regular faculty member of the Humboldt-Tulane ADR Summer Program.
